## Deployment Configuration Quick Start

Welcome to the AWS Elemental Cloud! This quick start guide describes how to get started in the cloud by configuring and starting services in a deployment.

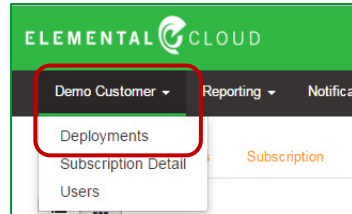

### Step A: Create a Deployment

The first step when using AWS Elemental Cloud is to create a deployment. A deployment is similar to a virtual datacenter, where you can run one or multiple services.

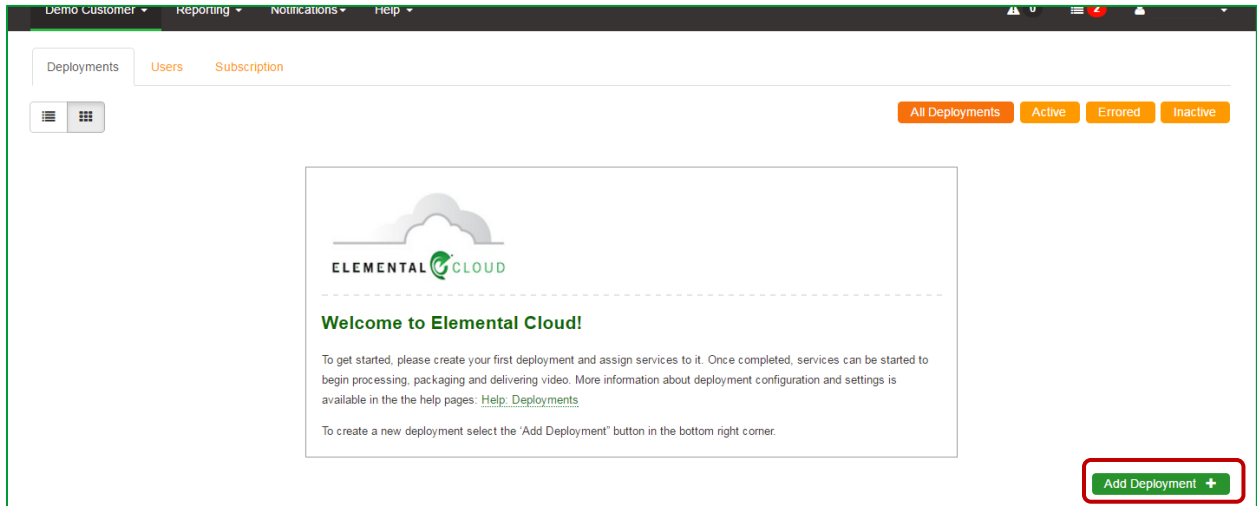
To create a deployment:

1. Click your subscription name to reveal navigation options.
2. Click **Deployments**.



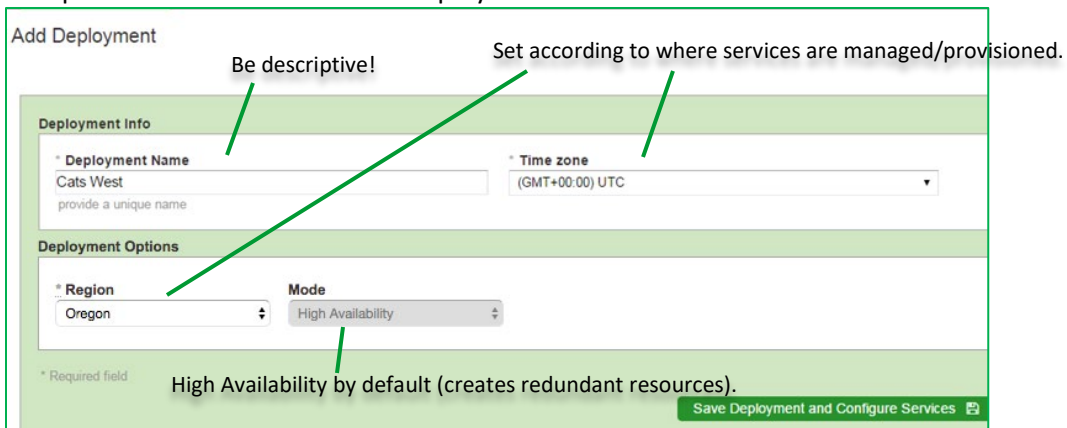
You are taken to the Deployments page.

3. In the bottom right of the page, click the **Add Deployment** button.



You are taken to the Add Deployment page.

4. Complete the fields to create the deployment.

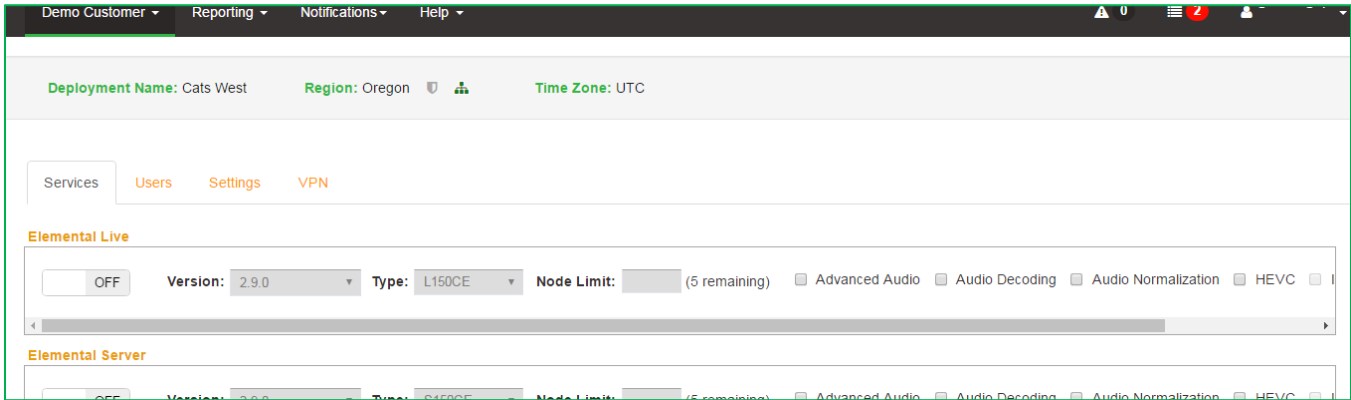


- When done, click the **Save Deployment and Configure Services** button.

The service detail page opens.

## Step B: Enable Services

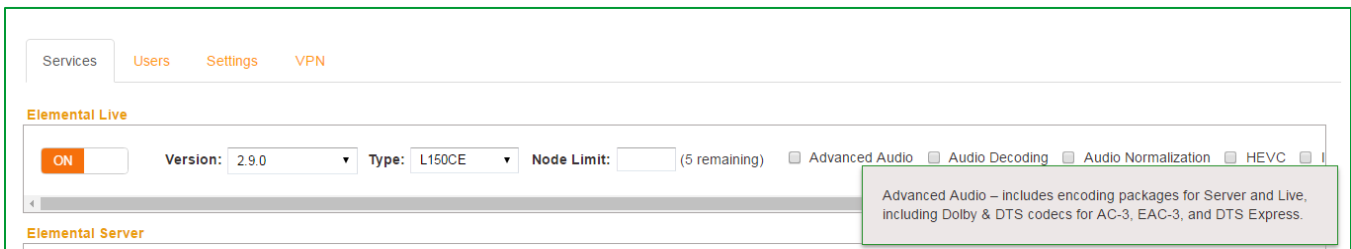
On the service detail page, available services are shown.



To enable a service:

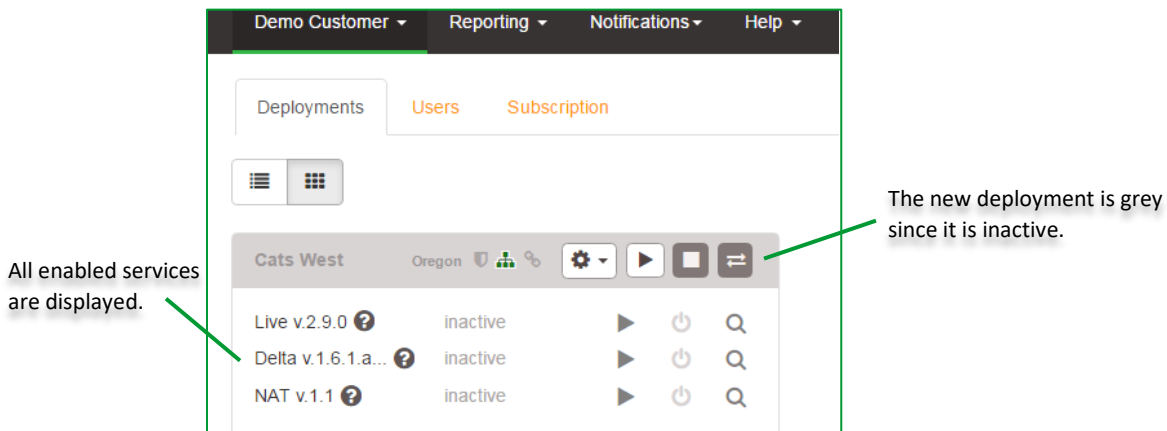
**Note:** Enabling a service just makes it available in the deployment. Services are not started until after the deployment is created. See Step C: Start Services.

- Locate the services you are using and toggle them on.



- Complete additional fields as needed for each service that is enabled. Hover over add-on options for additional information, if needed.
- When your selections are complete, click the **Save and Exit** button.

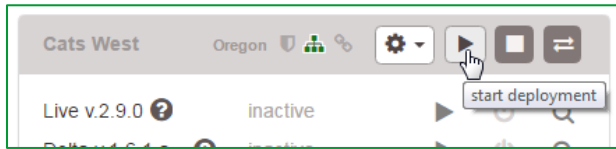
You are returned to the Deployments page.



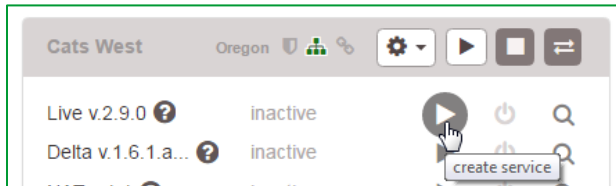
## Step C: Start Services

To make a deployment active, start at least one of the enabled services. You can:

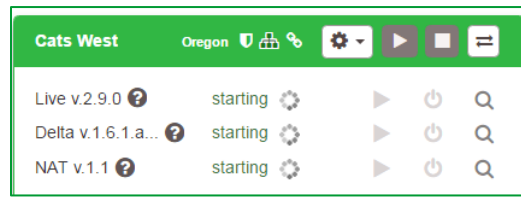
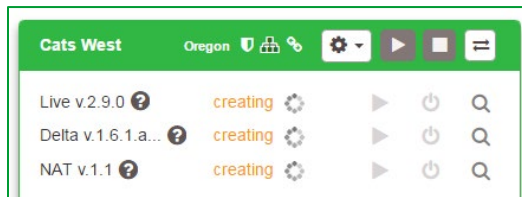
- Click the start deployment (play) button in the deployment header to start all services in the deployment.



- Click the create service (play) button in the row of a specific service to start only that service.

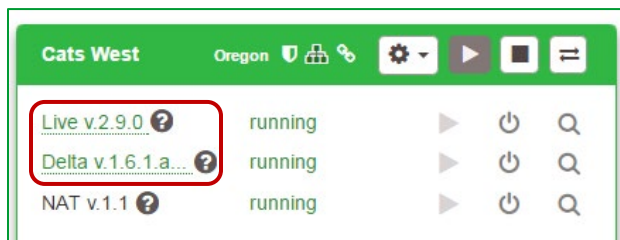


The service status goes from *creating* to *starting* as the service is spun up. Note that it can take up to 15 minutes for the services to start.



## Step D: Manage Content

Once a service is running, you can manage content by clicking the service name to open its management system.



The services have different management systems. See the table for more information:

| Service | Management System |
|---------|-------------------|
| Live    | Conductor Live    |
| Delta   | Delta             |
| Server  | Conductor File    |

When you click the service name, a new browser tab opens. Enter the same credentials you used to access AWS Elemental Cloud.
