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AWS Resource Explorer: API Reference Guide

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Welcome

AWS Resource Explorer is a resource search and discovery service. By using Resource Explorer, you can explore your resources using an internet search engine-like experience. Examples of resources include Amazon Relational Database Service (Amazon RDS) instances, Amazon Simple Storage Service (Amazon S3) buckets, or Amazon DynamoDB tables. You can search for your resources using resource metadata like names, tags, and IDs. Resource Explorer can search across all of the AWS Regions in your account in which you turn the service on, to simplify your cross-Region workloads.

Resource Explorer scans the resources in each of the AWS Regions in your AWS account in which you turn on Resource Explorer. Resource Explorer creates and maintains an index in each Region, with the details of that Region's resources.

You can search across all of the indexed Regions in your account by designating one of your AWS Regions to contain the aggregator index for the account. When you promote a local index in a Region to become the aggregator index for the account, Resource Explorer automatically replicates the index information from all local indexes in the other Regions to the aggregator index. Therefore, the Region with the aggregator index has a copy of all resource information for all Regions in the account where you turned on Resource Explorer. As a result, views in the aggregator index Region include resources from all of the indexed Regions in your account.

AssociateDefaultView

Sets the specified view as the default for the AWS Region in which you call this operation. When a user performs a <u>Search</u> that doesn't explicitly specify which view to use, then AWS Resource Explorer automatically chooses this default view for searches performed in this AWS Region.

If an AWS Region doesn't have a default view configured, then users must explicitly specify a view with every Search operation performed in that Region.

Minimum permissions

To call this operation, you must have the following permissions:

• Action: resource-explorer-2: AssociateDefaultView

Resource: No specific resource (*). However, an index must be present in the AWS Region in which you call the operation.

Related operations

- To remove a view as the default for an AWS Region, use <u>DisassociateDefaultView</u>.
- To list the available views, use ListViews.

Retrieves details about a list of views.

Minimum permissions

To call this operation, you must have the following permissions:

• Action: resource-explorer-2:BatchGetView

Resource: No specific resource (*).

This action supports using condition keys to check the tags attached to the view to limit permissions.

• Action: resource-explorer-2:GetView

Resource: the ARN of each view you want to retrieve.

This action supports using condition keys to check the tags attached to the view to limit permissions.

CreateIndex

Turns on AWS Resource Explorer in the AWS Region in which you called this operation by creating an index. Resource Explorer begins discovering the resources in this Region and stores the details about the resources in the index so that they can be gueried by using the Search operation. You can create only one index in a Region.



Note

This operation creates only a *local* index. To promote the local index in one AWS Region into the aggregator index for the AWS account, use the UpdateIndexType operation. For more information, see Turning on cross-Region search by creating an aggregator index in the AWS Resource Explorer User Guide.

For more details about what happens when you turn on Resource Explorer in an AWS Region, see Turn on Resource Explorer to index your resources in an AWS Region in the AWS Resource Explorer User Guide.

If this is the first AWS Region in which you've created an index for Resource Explorer, then this operation also creates a service-linked role in your AWS account that allows Resource Explorer to enumerate your resources to populate the index.

Minimum permissions

To run this command, you must have the following permissions:

Action: resource-explorer-2:CreateIndex

Resource: The ARN of the index (as it will exist after the operation completes) in the AWS Region and account in which you're trying to create the index. Use the wildcard character (*) at the end of the string to match the eventual UUID. For example, the following Resource element restricts the role or user to creating an index in only the us-east-2 Region of the specified account.

"Resource": "arn:aws:resource-explorer-2:us-west-2:<account-id>:index/*"

Alternatively, you can use "Resource": "*" to allow the role or user to create an index in any Region.

CreateIndex 15

• Action: iam: CreateServiceLinkedRole

Resource: No specific resource (*).

This permission is required only the first time you create an index to turn on Resource Explorer in the account. Resource Explorer uses this to create the <u>service-linked role needed to index the resources in your account</u>. Resource Explorer uses the same service-linked role for all additional indexes you create afterwards.

ConflictException

If you attempted to create a view, then the request failed because either you specified parameters that didn't match the original request, or you attempted to create a view with a name that already exists in this AWS Region.

If you attempted to create an index, then the request failed because either you specified parameters that didn't match the original request, or an index already exists in the current AWS Region.

Errors 18

If you attempted to update an index type to AGGREGATOR, then the request failed because you already have an AGGREGATOR index in a different AWS Region.

HTTP Status Code: 409

InternalServerException

The request failed because of internal service error. Try your request again later.

HTTP Status Code: 500

ThrottlingException

CreateView

Creates a view that users can query by using the <u>Search</u> operation. Results from queries that you make using this view include only resources that match the view's Filters. For more information about AWS Resource Explorer views, see <u>Managing views</u> in the <u>AWS Resource Explorer User Guide</u>.

Only the principals with an IAM identity-based policy that grants Allow to the Search action on a Resource with the <u>Amazon resource name (ARN)</u> of this view can <u>Search</u> using views you create with this operation.

Minimum permissions

To call this operation, you must have the following permissions:

Action: resource-explorer-2:CreateView

Resource:

The name must be no more than 64 characters long, and can include letters, digits, and the dash (-) character. The name must be unique within its AWS Region.

Important

This query string in the context of this operation supports only filter prefixes with optional operators. It doesn't support free-form text. For example, the string region:us* service:ec2 -tag:stage=prod includes all Amazon EC2 resources in any AWS Region that begins with the letters us and is not tagged with a key Stage that has the value prod.

Example 2 – Create a view that filters to only resource types for a single service

The following example creates a view in AWS Region us-east-1 that returns only those resources in the Region that are associated with the Amazon EC2 service. The ClientToken parameter value

is a randomly generated UUID. Because this view is in the Region that contains the aggregator index, it can include results that match the filter from all Regions in the account that contain a Resource Explorer index.

However, it can take several hours for replication from all other Regions to complete.

Important

You can have only one aggregator index per AWS account. Before you can promote a different index to be the aggregator index for the account, you must first demote the existing aggregator index to type LOCAL.

LOCAL index type

The index contains information about resources in only the AWS Region in which the index exists. If an aggregator index in another Region exists, then information in this local index is replicated to the aggregator index.

When you change the index type to LOCAL, Resource Explorer turns off the replication of resource information from all other AWS Regions in the AWS account to this Region. The aggregator index remains in the UPDATING state until all replication with other Regions successfully stops. You can check the status of the asynchronous task by using the GetIndex

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operation. When Resource Explorer successfully stops all replication with other Regions, the Status response of that operation changes from UPDATING to ACTIVE. Separately, the resource information from other Regions that was previously stored in the index is deleted within 30 days by another background task. Until that asynchronous task completes, some results from other Regions can continue to appear in search results.

In every response from an AWS Query API, there is a ResponseMetadata element, which contains a RequestId element. This string is a unique identifier that AWS assigns to provide tracking information. Although RequestId is included as part of every response, it isn't listed on the individual API documentation pages to improve readability and to reduce redundancy.
